










The "me" generation has aged to become the most influential segment of society




Many of the ills of society – crime, poverty, lack of business productivity, declining SAT scores, etc. – are often blamed on a poor self image

From Eden to eternity the chief cause of evildoing has been and will continue to be self and selfishness





Self is at the root of all sin






The apostle Paul agrees with Pogo (Rom. 7:14-24; 1 Cor. 10:13)




Romans 7:14-24

For we know that the law is spiritual, but I am carnal, sold under sin. 15 For what I am doing, I do not understand. For what I will to do, that I do not practice; but what I hate, that I do. 16 If, then, I do what I will not to do, I agree with the law that it is good. 17 But now, it is no longer I who do it, but sin that dwells in me. \blacksquare




Romans 7:14-24

18 For I know that in me (that is, in my flesh) nothing good dwells; for to will is present with me, but how to perform what is good I do not find. 19 For the good that I will to do, I do not do; but the evil I will not to do, that I practice. 20 Now if I do what I will not to do, it is no longer I who do it, but sin that dwells in me. ■



Romans 7:14-24

21 I find then a law, that evil is present with me, the one who wills to do good. 22 For I delight in the law of God according to the inward man. 23 But I see another law in my members, warring against the law of my mind, and bringing me into captivity to the law of sin which is in my members. 24 O wretched man that I am! Who will deliver me from this body of death?

The proper attitude toward self is a sign of maturity




The best definition of maturity I have ever heard:

"When you arrive at and accept the realization that you are not the center of the universe"






Cain

- He asked, "Am I my brother's keeper?"




King Ahab (1 Kings 21)

- Consider also the rich "fool" of Luke 12:13-21




Luke 12:13-21

Then one from the crowd said to Him, "Teacher, tell my brother to divide the inheritance with me." 14 But He said to him, "Man, who made Me a judge or an arbitrator over you?" 15 And He said to them, "Take heed and beware of covetousness, for one's life does not consist in the abundance of the things he possesses." ■



Luke 12:13-21

16 Then He spoke a parable to them, saying: "The ground of a certain rich man yielded plentifully. 17 And he thought within himself, saying, 'What shall I do, since I have no room to store my crops?' 18 So he said, 'I will do this: I will pull down my barns and build greater, and there I will store all my crops and my goods. ■



Luke 12:13-21

19 And I will say to my soul, "Soul, you have many goods laid up for many years; take your ease; eat, drink, and be merry." 20 But God said to him, 'Fool! This night your soul will be required of you; then whose will those things be which you have provided?' 21 So is he who lays up treasure for himself, and is not rich toward God."



David (2 Samuel 11)

- His only thought was the desire to fulfill his own pleasures
- His selfishness led to adultery and murder



James and John (Matthew 20)

- Theirs was a desire for power and prestige for themselves
- They wanted places of honor



The Prodigal's Older Brother (Luke 15)

He had no compassion or love

Self-Centeredness


- Absorbed, wrapped up in self
- No one enjoys a self-centered person
- It is easy to see it in others but hard to recognize in self



Self-Centeredness


The example of the priest and the Levite (Luke 10:30-32)

 Among their many other sins, these men were guilty of self-centeredness and a lack of compassion



Luke 10:30-32

Then Jesus answered and said: "A certain man went down from Jerusalem to Jericho, and fell among thieves, who stripped him of his clothing, wounded him, and departed, leaving him half dead. 31 Now by chance a certain priest came down that road. And when he saw him, he passed by on the other side. ■




Luke 10:30-32

32 Likewise a Levite, when he arrived at the place, came and looked, and passed by on the other side.




Self-Conceit

- An exaggerated estimation of one's own ability, powers or importance
- A number of passages in Scripture show us that God hates pride




Proverbs 16:18

Pride goes before destruction, and a haughty spirit before a fall.




James 4:6

Humble yourselves in the sight of the Lord, and He will lift you up.




Luke 18:14

Self-Conceit

We are not to think too highly of self (Rom. 12:3)



Romans 12:3

For I say, through the grace given to me, to everyone who is among you, not to think of himself more highly than he ought to think, but to think soberly, as God has dealt to each one a measure of faith.



Self-Willed


This is being stubborn, set on having one's own way



Self-Willed

Examples of this problem include:

- Jonah
- The rich fool (Luke 12:16)
- Those who stoned Stephen and their ancestors (Acts 7:51-53)




Acts 7:51-53

"You stiffnecked and uncircumcised in heart and ears! You always resist the Holy Spirit; as your fathers did, so do you. 52 Which of the prophets did your fathers not persecute? And they killed those who foretold the coming of the Just One, of whom you now have become the betrayers and murderers, 53 who have received the law by the direction of angels and have not kept it."



Self-Willed

God does not want the leaders of His people to be self-willed (Titus 1:7)



Titus 1:7

For a bishop must be blameless, as a steward of God, not self-willed, not quick-tempered, not given to wine, not violent, not greedy for money...



Self-Indulgence


- It is giving free course to one's own passions, desires and inclinations
- It is a sin which leads one from God



Self-Indulgence


Examples of self-indulgence include:

- The Gentiles (Rom. 1:24-26)
- Demas (2 Tim. 4:9-10)



Romans 1:24-26

Therefore God also gave them up to uncleanness, in the lusts of their hearts, to dishonor their bodies among themselves, 25 who exchanged the truth of God for the lie, and worshiped and served the creature rather than the Creator, who is blessed forever. Amen. 26 For this reason God gave them up to vile passions. For even their women exchanged the natural use for what is against nature.



2 Timothy 4:9-10

Be diligent to come to me quickly; 10 for Demas has forsaken me, having loved this present world, and has departed for Thessalonica...




Self-Righteousness

- This is when one is righteous in his own eyes, by his own standard
- It was a trait of the Pharisees that was condemned (Luke 18:9-14; Rom. 10:1-3)




Luke 18:9-14

Also He spoke this parable to some who trusted in themselves that they were righteous, and despised others: 10 "Two men went up to the temple to pray, one a Pharisee and the other a tax collector. 11 The Pharisee stood and prayed thus with himself, 'God, I thank You that I am not like other men – extortioners, unjust, adulterers, or even as this tax collector. •



Luke 18:9-14

12 I fast twice a week; I give tithes of all that I possess.' 13 And the tax collector, standing afar off, would not so much as raise his eyes to heaven, but beat his breast, saying, 'God, be merciful to me a sinner!' 14 I tell you, this man went down to his house justified rather than the other; for everyone who exalts him-self will be humbled, and he who humbles himself will be exalted."



Romans 10:1-3

Brethren, my heart's desire and prayer to God for Israel is that they may be saved. 2 For I bear them witness that they have a zeal for God, but not according to knowledge. 3 For they being ignorant of God's righteousness, and seeking to establish their own righteousness, have not submitted to the righteousness of God.



Self-Satisfaction

This is being pleased with who and what one is



Self-Satisfaction

The satisfied person has already reached his goal

- He has no other worlds to conquer, no loftier heights to scale, no greater work to do
- His journey can only be downward



Self-Satisfaction

On the other hand, it is not possible to establish bounds for the person who is not satisfied with himself or his accomplishments





Exercise self-denial (Matt. 16:24)




Matthew 16:24

Humble yourself before God (1 Pet. 5:6)




1 Peter 5:6



Exercise self-control




Proverbs 16:32

But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, longsuffering, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, 23 gentleness, self-control...




2 Peter 1:5-8


Practice self-sacrifice (2 Cor. 8:1-5; Rom. 12:1)



2 Corinthians 8:1-5



4 imploring us with much urgency that we would receive the gift and the fellowship of the ministering to the saints. 5 And not only as we had hoped, but they first gave themselves to the Lord, and then to us by the will of God.
